



CHURCH PROFILE & Lead Paston Description



We are a small, yet diverse church, with a heart for God.

Ninety-five years ago, our church founders were Chinese, but God has now blessed our church with a greater diversity of members and attendees. All services and meetings are in English. Blending the old with the new, our worship style reflects the intergenerational make up of the CCC. Most of our music is contemporary Christian music, but we also mix in traditional hymns.

On Sunday mornings we have worship service and Sunday school, followed by informal fellowship and refreshments. During the week, the church has weekly Bible studies for Adults (Monday), Men (Tuesday) and Women (Wednesday), as well as a monthly Bible study group. A youth group also meets every other week.

Our outreach ministry includes a youth basketball program and a hula/ukulele outreach fellowship group. Additionally, we have two large community outreach events each year; a Fall Family Fellowship Festival that connects with the community through food and entertainment, and a Joong (Chinese Tamale) project, which brings church members and the community together to make a traditional Chinese food.

Many of our earlier members from the first and second generation are no longer with us, leaving just a few members of that generation in their eighties and nineties. The current congregation is now composed of a mixture of people, some who are offspring of the original members, as well as others of various nationalities and ages. Although most of the membership are seniors, there are frequent attendees in their forties and fifties. We currently have 68 active confessing members. Average attendance for Sunday Worship is about 75 people.





Our History

Founded in 1924, Chinese Community Church shared space in a converted residence originally on 5th and P Streets and then a few years later, moved to 519 N Street. In 1939, the fifteenth year of CCC's early history, a severe storm seriously damaged the church, forcing it to be demolished. With the help of the Reformed Church in America, the congregation built a new two-story structure which enabled the church to grow. The church continued to thrive through the mid-1940s, but after WWII, many Chinese were now able to move into the suburbs away from the downtown church, causing its numbers to decrease. For several years, the church struggled. In the late 1940s the consistory made the decision to implement a plan to move the church to a new location. With the help of the RCA again, the church built a new sanctuary and education building at its present site in 1951. And in 2007, CCC renovated and built a new education building and added larger kitchen facilities as well as a gym/ fellowship center.

Job Responsibilities

- To provide biblically based preaching and teaching ministry
- Act as the primary teaching Pastor.

- Develop worship services and sermons that speak to members and attendees of diverse ages and levels of spiritual maturity.
- To spearhead overall vision and vision casting
- To administer Sacraments of Communion.

- Officiate weddings, funerals, baptisms and confirmations.
- To lead and supervise staff in support of the church's ministries.
